Subject: Mine Resistant Ambush Protected Vehicle Program Update

1. The Joint Requirements Oversight Council (JROC) reviewed the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) program and Services' adjustments to their vehicle requirements.
2. The JROC reviewed and approved the Marine Corps' refined requirement for 2,225 MRAP vehicles and the Air Force's refined requirement for 558 MRAP vehicles. This supports their operational assessment of the vehicles that reviewed changes in mission tasking and the incorporation of the vehicles into existing Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures. Additionally, USSOCOM has refined their requirement from 333 to 344 MRAP vehicles. This supports their identified need for 11 MRAP vehicle recovery variants in support of efforts in Operation Enduring Freedom.
3. The JROC reviewed and approved the Army's range of MRAP vehicle requirement for 10,433 to 15,884 vehicles based on the range of future force structure and MRAP to Up-Armored HMMVW mix. In order to support the timely fulfillment of Theater requirements and mitigate against production delays the Army established a new interim requirement for 12,000 MRAP vehicles.
4. Additionally, the JROC recommends the following factors be considered in coordination with OSD (AT&L) as the final acquisition profile is defined:
 - a. Army preference for which production lines remain open.
 - b. Sustained production to make up for combat losses.
 - c. The ability to rapidly regenerate production capacity if required.
